

## The 2030 Agenda and Peruvian Libraries

*English translation of the original paper: La Agenda 2030 y las bibliotecas peruanas*

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### **Abstract:**

*This paper presents the results of 20 experiences of Peruvian libraries working for the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) approved in 2015. The results show the activities registered until May 15, 2017.*

*The study analyzes the following variables for the participating institutions: type of institution, scope of the experience, dates of intervention, place of execution, description of the experience, objectives to achieve, beneficiaries, and institutions participating in the program, among others.*

*The results show that most libraries offer services that support SDG 4: quality education to all, which obtains 13 mentions, followed by SDG 16, which seeks peaceful societies and advocates for human rights and public access to information.*

*Although the number of responses is not significant, we can conclude that the experiences recorded show that Peruvian libraries are effectively contributing to the achievement of SDGs and the 2030 Agenda is the road map for the development of the country with the support of library services.*

## Resumen:

*El presente trabajo presenta los resultados de 20 experiencias de bibliotecas peruanas que están apoyando al logro de los Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible (SDG) aprobados por las Naciones Unidas el 2015. Los resultados muestran las actividades registradas hasta el 15 de mayo de 2017.*

*En el estudio se analizan las siguientes variables de las instituciones participantes: tipo de institución, alcance de la experiencia, fechas de intervención, lugar de ejecución, descripción de la experiencia, objetivos a lograr, beneficiarios, otras instituciones participantes en el programa.*

*Los resultados demuestran que la mayoría de bibliotecas ofrecen servicios relacionados a proveer educación de calidad en apoyo del SDG 4, con 13 menciones, seguido del SDG 16, que busca una vida en sociedades pacíficas y defensa de los derechos humanos y el acceso público a la información.*

*Aunque el número de respuestas no es significativo, se concluye que las experiencias registradas muestran que las bibliotecas peruanas están aportando efectivamente al logro de los SDG y que la Agenda 2030 es la hoja de ruta a seguir para el desarrollo del país con el apoyo de los servicios bibliotecarios.*

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## Introduction

The United Nations approved the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) on September 25, 2015, with the aim of achieving a more habitable world for all humanity, to become more economical, social and cultural egalitarian for all societies.

IFLA has assumed a leading role conscious of the inequalities and crises that exists throughout the world, by encouraging among its members a sound support for the achievement of SDGs in each country. Thus, with its International Advocacy Program (IAP), it has carried out numerous workshops involving associations from more than 62 countries and encouraging libraries to position themselves as central points to achieve compliance with SDGs

## SDGs in Perú

Peru is one of the signatory countries of the SDGs and is working on their achievement in different fronts. The Centro Nacional de Planeamiento Estratégico (CEPLAN), as the central point for the Sistema Nacional de Planeamiento Estratégico (SINAPLAN), submitted in February 2017, a proposal for the future vision of the country, being the 2030 Agenda, one of the main references to ensure the well-being of the population<sup>1</sup> and the guide for the policies and plans<sup>2</sup> for all levels of Government.

The “Sistema de Monitoreo para los Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible” is an instrument of the Instituto Nacional de Estadística e Informática (INEI), in which the country's development indicators have been aligned with the 17 SDGs.<sup>3</sup> From it, citizens can monitor the progress of the 17 goals.

The priority objectives for Peru are preservation and control of the environment and biodiversity, as well as actions aimed at reducing poverty, inclusion of people with disabilities, expansion of school coverage and quality education, and at the same time efforts for maintaining peace and the fight against corruption.

## **The SDGs and the work of libraries in Perú**

In this context, the Colegio de Bibliotecólogos del Perú (CBP) (Peruvian Library Association) responds to IFLA's call to take active leadership among its members and the whole society, in order to value the role of library and knowledge management as part of the development of the country. In this respect, the CBP may identify four main points related to the SDGs:

1. From Public libraries (municipal, community or NGO-driven) and School libraries which provide services that consolidate learning experiences, self-learning, digital literacy and entertainment.

Among the experiences gathered are those made by the municipal libraries of Miraflores, *El Casero del Libro* (Books delivered at public markets) (PE07) and *Noches de las Librerías* (the Night of Bookstores) (PE08); in San Borja Library the program *Lee San Borja Lee* (Read San Borja Read) (PE05), and the one from San Isidro *San Isidro Lee* (San Isidro reads) (PE06). In addition we have La Casa de la Literatura which offers *Abuelos y Abuelas Cuentacuentos* (Grandparents and grandmothers storytelling) (PE19) and *Bebetecas* (Libraries for babies) (PE 20). While the Davy College is planning the program *ConoSer* (Know ourselves) (PE09) that encourages learning with creativity and playful activities (see experiences in Annex 1).

2. From Specialized Libraries that provide information services to the stakeholders involved in the definition and implementation of policies in their sectors. Examples are the CBP (PE01) through the activity *Apoyo al Programa de Incentivos a la Mejora de la Gestión Municipal mediante Planes Municipales del Libro y la Lectura* (Support to the Program of incentives to improve Municipal Management through Municipal Book and Reading Plans) which supports municipalities in different areas of the country, especially those affected by natural disasters occurred in January-March 2017. In this manner, they can increase the value of their libraries and turn them into central focus to build a responsible citizenship. The Autoridad Nacional del Servicio Civil (SERVIR) offers public sector decision makers *Exposiciones bibliográficas digitales* (digital bibliographic exhibitions) (PE12) and *"En 1 minuto"* (current awareness newsletters) (PE13). The Ministerio del Ambiente (MINAM), through its program *Bibliotecas Regionales del Ambiente* (Regional environmental libraries) (PE14) provides information to decision makers in the main regions of the country. While the Comisión para la Promoción de las Exportaciones y Turismo (PROMPERU) directs its services to financiers and potential exporters offering

them *Acceso a la información digital especializada en comercio exterior* (Access to specialized digital information in foreign trade) (PE11).

3. From specialized libraries that provide information services in support of social, productive and cultural development, and reaffirmation of identity.

It is important that social and cultural information lead citizens to integrate within the nation social, political, administrative, financial, etc. structure in their communities, including cultural affairs. Additionally to those mentioned, other experiences contribute to achieve cultural aims, such as the project for systematizing the information *Koha* (PE10) created by the Museo Nacional de Arqueología y Antropología; also included in this area is the project *Alianzas estratégicas entre las Hemerotecas de Lima Metropolitana* (strategic partnerships among Serials rooms on Metropolitan Lima) developed by the Biblioteca Nacional del Perú (BNP) (PE02). Other contributions to the social area are: *Quijote para la vida* (Quixote for Life) (PE16) that develops leadership skills in children from depressed areas, while the Centro de Información y Educación para la Prevención del Abuso de las Drogas (CEDRO) helps to reaffirm the local identity and self-learning of children and youth at risk through the programs Bibliotecas Comunitarias CEDRO (community libraries) (PE17) and *Bibliotecas para el Desarrollo* (Libraries for Development) (PE18). At the same time the BNP develops the *Capacitación para usuarios inclusivos* (Training for inclusive users) (PE03) teaching reading and production of audio books and Braille materials.

4. From the professional work, participating in spaces that support the processes of monitoring and follow-up to SDGs indicators.

In this sense, both the municipal libraries and the CBP provide training, talks and discussion spaces for professionals and the public sensitizing them in relation to the SDGs, and committing them to the dissemination and contribution to the achievement of the SDGs. The CBP project, provides also opportunities for coordination with other organizations such as Foro del Acuerdo Nacional y la Mesa de Concertación de la Lucha contra la Pobreza.

## Data Analysis

In Peru the CBP assumed the task of disseminating the “IFLA: Survey on Examples of how Libraries contribute to the United Nations 2030 Agenda”<sup>4</sup>. The CBP delivered talks and workshops about the SDGs<sup>5</sup>, and encourage members to participate. The analysis bellow is based on the data registered until May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

## Registered Experiences

In total, 20 experiences were collected, registered by 20 institutions. At the same time, those experiences mentioned up to 30 institutions involved in the programs listed. Table 1 shows the type of institutions that register their experiences.

### The SDGs and the activities registered

A number of experiences and examples were registered (see Annexes 1 and 2). The Table Nr. 2 and the Annex 2 show the distribution of the experiences related to the SDGs (as asked in question 19 of the Survey). As we can see, the most named SDG was number 04 (education of quality), with 13 mentions, followed by SDG 16, with seven mentions; while SDG 03, 06, 07, 12, 14 y 15, did not received any mention.

Although the SDGs not mentioned include some goals that are a priority for the country, such as good health (SDG 03) or clean water and energy (SDGs 06 and 07), we know that there are libraries with good examples of activities related to them, but they were not registered.

In relation to the advance achieved in their activities, most of the libraries mentioned that those activities are in process, that is, 16 out of 20 mentioned they are on course, and some even added that they have become a permanent service in their libraries.

When analyzing the data, we can see that all the institutions that register their experiences are located in Lima, although many of them benefit people in different areas of the country. Thus, we have one institution that works simultaneously in Lima and in other province of the country, while three of the institutions work only in the provinces, particularly in poverty or high-risk areas, and the remaining 16 work only in Lima.

## **Conclusions**

This is the first analysis on how libraries and information services in Perú see their work in relation to the SDGs, a view that will serve as the basis for other studies on the topic.

Although we can realize that almost all services are involved in reducing poverty (SDG 01), and serving vulnerable population (even in an indirect way), not all of them recognize that. The results show that almost all services recognize their support to SDG 04, as they offer activities such as reading promotion, digital information literacy, and the like, particularly in deprived or risky areas.

The improvement of life conditions, with the support of current, true and validated information offered by libraries and information services, will result in a well-prepared population to face the challenges to the society, and particularly those imposed by the technological advances, the need for preserving the natural resources and the appropriate use of them (particularly potable water) and the like.

It is important to continue with the development of more and better activities that support and disseminate the knowledge of the SDGs and their relation to libraries and information services and encourage more experiences to be registered. At the same time working with authorities and decision makers for them to value the role of libraries in supporting the SDGs as allies for accomplishing the goals by 2030.
